




















The Fiji Qualifications Framework





Sustaining QA within a Legal Framework

- *Positive impact on QA and support by stakeholders
- *Challenges:
 - *Timeliness in QA and currency of legislation



- *Diversity in delivery modes (globalization)
- *Student mobility across borders
- *Review of guidelines and procedures
- * "one size fits all"

QA and the Fiji Qualifications Framework

- *Adopted levels 3 -12 of SCQF Partnership Board
- *Challenges:
 - *credits system,
 - * approach to accreditation,
 - *proliferation of provider programs,
 - *delivery and assessment of NQs
 - *shift in operation mode of HEIs
 - *need to assist HEIs in program accreditation



Stakeholders Expectations and the QA System

- *Legal Status of the QA System positive impact
- *Challenges:
